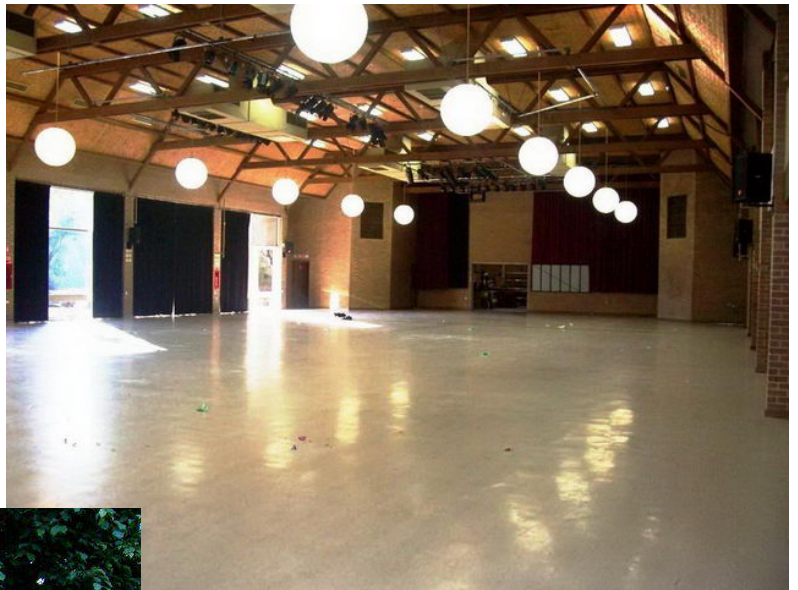


Come to Melbourne in 2007 to celebrate ANPA's 25th silver anniversary National. Last held in Melbourne in 2003, with a then record of 3,100 entries, 2007 is shaping up to be an even better event. The Melbourne national is uniquely being presented by a federation of Victorian Fancy Pigeon clubs in an united effort.

A lot of effort will be put in to make it the complete experience, a special deal has been done with a nearby Hotel & the central location for added convenience. Bring the whole family to Melbourne as there is plenty to see do.

The venue for the 2007 Melbourne National is on the grounds of the La Trobe University, perfectly located 20mins from the city & from the airport.

Union hall is a modern hall that will house the pigeons, the presentation dinner will be held on site at the amazing Eagle room which is a outside garden environment underneath a huge glass dome. The birds will be safe as there is 24hr security on site.

Melbourne stands on the banks of the Yarra River and the shores of Port Philip Bay. The city is Australia's second largest and home to about 3.3 million people.

More than any other Australian city, Melbourne evokes comparisons with Europe in architecture, climate and style.



Some 170 languages are spoken in this multicultural city and the diversity of restaurants is second to none. More than 4000 restaurants, cafés and bistros feature more than 70 styles of cuisine.

Among Melbourne's many fascinations, several streets and suburbs are particularly noteworthy. Toorak Road and Chapel Street, South Yarra, offer the city's best shopping, dining, strolling and people-watching. Check Toorak Road for established fashion names; Chapel Street for trendy young designers. There are shoe boutiques, gourmet food shops and a huge range of restaurants and bistros.

The beachfront suburb of St Kilda is best-known for its cake shops and modern bistros, bars and cafés. It has two distinct faces: the 24-hour nightlife of Fitzroy Street and the cafés

and delicatessens of Acland Street. St Kilda's landmark is Luna Park with its laughing face and roller-coaster rides.

Lyon Street, Carlton, is Melbourne's little slice of Italy, with pasta restaurants galore. Dotted among them are quality fashion boutiques, wine bars, cheese shops and delicatessens.

The hotel of choice is the Rydges on the Bell Preston, a special has been done with twin shares rooms starting at \$89 per night. A shuttle bus service will also be provided to get you to the show venue.



HOW TO GET THERE

Rydges on Bell Preston Melbourne is conveniently located 20 minutes from the Melbourne CBD and just 20 minutes from Melbourne's International Airport. From the Airport drive along the Tullamarine Freeway toward the city and turn left at the Bell Street exit. The hotel is located at 205 Bell St.
